Book Review

METAL STATISTICS 1959-68, 56th ANNUAL ISSUE BY METAL GESELLSCHAFT AKTIENGESELLSCHAFT, P.O. BOX 2609, FRANKFURT AM MAIN, GERMANY

This annual summary of the basic statistics of the major and some minor non-ferrous metals is one of the most important and reliable world sources of such information. The major metals dealt with are aluminium, lead, copper, tin and zinc. Other metals covered are magnesium, nickel, silver, mercury and cadmium. Notable exceptions are antimony, and the alloy metals, columbium, chromium, manganese, molybdenum, tantalum, tungsten, and vanadium as well as cobalt and titanium.

The statistics are very detailed covering mine production, metal production, consumption, imports and exports, and prices. Coverage is extended to the Soviet block countries.

The volume is divided into five parts:

The first is an introduction and summary of the Metal Industry of the year under review; world tables of basic statistics; detailed statistics by countries; price tables; and price graphs.

The volume is well printed and is a valuable addition to the statistical section of any library serving the mineral and mining industry. It is distributed free by the company to any reputable organization or persons who register their requirements.
